As my father was a diplomat working for UNICEF I have had the opportunity to live and study in many parts of the world since a very early age. Our travels brought me to India to study and that is when I became a follower of Bhagwan Shree Rayneesh in 1974. From that moment on he has never ceased to amaze me.
