
Devadeep, the Rajneesh Sannyas Ashram in Washington has asked me to provide information concerning why, in relation to one's field the Baghwan is considered a man of exceptional merit in the arts.

We publish a series of books written by our Director called Primers for the Age of Inner Space. One of these in particular was written in part after study of the Baghwan's work. This book, The Indra Web concerns, as its subtitle indicates, 'the renewal of ancient Oriental concepts in modern Western thought'.
